- 3. State your aims and theories What did you want to achieve? Why did you structure it the way you did? What theories have you developed about your topic?
- 4. State your standpoint and values What are your own opinions? Where do you stand on the question? How will you justify your conclusion?
- 5. State your thesis and concession with reasons
- 6. State your methodology Why did you choose it? How does it help the reader understand your objectives? How did you divide the topic and why? Why did you structure it the way you did?
- 7. Sources you have used Why did you choose the people you chose? Why are they valuable to your argument?
- 8. Define key terms (keep this to a minimum)
