A-level Proposal Form Tips:

To fill out the top of the form: name of centre is Sarasota High School, centre number is US213, syllabus title is Global Perspectives and Research, syllabus code is 9239, component number 04, examination session is June (click the box to the right of the word June) 2017. The title of proposal is where you enter your question.

When writing the proposal form, the Cambridge reviewers are looking for a few things:

- The writer has a handle on the topic. Although the directions for the proposal explicitly say you shouldn't have to conduct research to complete the form, basic research is basically a necessity to show that you understand the parameters of your topic and know what you're looking for when you do extensive research. This includes titles of the books and the major scholarly sites (i.e. a Yale research article specific to your topic) you are going to utilize with basic knowledge on both.
- 2. You personally are passionate about (or even affected by) the topic. For example, Daryn wrote on the ethicality of using humans as test subjects for medicine and she wants to become a pharmacist.
- 3. You include a pseudo-reflection. This means outlining how you decided on your topic. Include how you are passionate about/affected by the topic here.
- 4. Basic definitions (again I know they said no references, but it's necessary) of key words in your questions. You can say something along the lines of, "In the scope of this essay, _____ will have _____ parameters and will exclude _____" so that the words better fit your topic.

To name your file follow this format: 9239_US213_your candidate number_04
