Ideas or Acts Passed During Administration:

The Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 is a United States federal law requiring larger employers to provide employees job-protected unpaid leave due to a serious health condition that makes the employee unable to perform his or her job, or to care for a sick family member, or to care for a new child. The FMLA is administered by the Wage and Hour Division of the Employment Standards Administration of the United States Department of Labor.

The Gramm–Leach–Bliley Act , also known as the Financial Services Modernization Act of 1999, is an act of the 106th United States Congress. It was signed into law by President Bill Clinton and it repealed part of the Glass-Steagall Act of 1933, opening up the market among banking companies, securities companies and insurance companies. The Glass-Steagall Act prohibited any one institution from acting as any combination of an investment bank, a commercial bank, and an insurance company.

The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 was federal law that was enacted by the 103rd United States Congress and signed into law by President Bill Clinton. It has also been referred to, unofficially, as the Deficit Reduction Act of 1993. Part XIII, which dealt with taxes, is also called the Revenue Reconciliation Act of 1993.

The Foster Care Independence Act is an Act of Congress signed into law by President Bill Clinton on December 14, 1999. The Act supports provision of health insurance to former foster children, up to the age of 21, by way of states using Medicaid funds. It permits such youths to have assets up to \$10,000 without compromising their assistance. It expands funds for these 18-to-21-year-olds to benefit from Independent living programs from \$70 million to \$140 million
