What makes a good question?

AS Level-

- A good question is one that can be (at least somewhat) easily researched
 - If the question is one that is fairly new or doesn't have much research, it might be difficult to find **good** examples to fit your reasons
- A good AS question has two arguable sides (thesis and concession), and has at least two reasons for each side
 - The reasons should support the question, in other words, if you can't arrange your question to say either side supported by a reason, it doesn't match
 - For example, "Is it inhumane to domesticate animals?" On one hand, animals shouldn't be domesticated because there are ethical issues at stake and many animals are abandoned after growing up, on the other hand, animals provide companionship and can fulfil lifesaving duties that most humans cannot.
 - To check to see if my reasons support my question, the question can be rearranged to make a true statement, for example, "Animals should not be domesticated **because** many are abandoned after they grow out of the puppy stage."
- A good question is not generic or common, as these are boring to the graders and will not earn you any points for creativity, you'll be seen as doing the minimum
- The question needs to be global, by this, it means it needs to be relevant and a problem in other countries, not just MEDCs
- The question needs to begin with should, is, or are
- The question cannot use and/or
- Ask a peer for suggestions or advice on your question and reasons

Good AS Level Questions-

- **BAD**- Is food a human right or not? (**Can't use or**)
 - **GOOD**- Should food be a human right?
- **BAD**- Should we make college free and a right for all? (**Can't use and, pick one or combine**)
 - **GOOD**- Should higher education be free for everyone?
- **BAD**- Does standardized testing help today's students? (**Can't use does**)
 - **GOOD**- Are standardized tests effective?
- **BAD**- Should Petland be shut down? (**Not Global**)

- GOOD- Should animals be domesticated?
- BAD- Are phones bad for us? (**Boring and generic**)
 - GOOD- Is technology a necessity in the 21st century?
- GOOD- Should vaccines be mandatory for all?
- GOOD- Is vegetarianism the answer?
- GOOD- Are flowers necessary in today's world?
- These are good because they are global, two-sided, have at least two reasons for each side, are easily researchable, and start off correctly (is, are, or should).
